

Get your child moving in the right direction

While sighted children typically learn about things like movement and direction from watching others, children with a vision impairment often need a little extra help.

Mobility skills

Also known as 'habilitation', Guide Dogs provides support to help children move around safely and confidently. We can help teach them skills like:

- understanding how body parts move
- posture and walking style, how to skip or run
- spatial concepts and orientation
- listening skills and identifying sounds
- cane skills and navigating a new place
- learning road safety and using public transport.

Life skills

We can also give children and young people the tools and support to manage their lives with assurance and independence, including:

- organisational skills
- · kitchen skills
- social skills
- · personal care skills
- money management and shopping skills
- personal safety
- help getting to know new places and managing life changes, like moving up to secondary school
- help finding other useful agencies and groups.

We believe that vision impairment shouldn't prevent children and young people reaching their full potential.
